PASTOR'S PEN

Well I thought our first week having the 8 a.m. service in the sanctuary went pretty well, all things considered. There was snow on the ground and still more coming down, but 54 of us met for 8 a.m. worship in the sanctuary on February 14th.

- ✚ It was different...everyone had to find a new place to sit...
- ✚ it was a change...from the closeness and charm of the chapel to the bigger space of one half of the sanctuary...
- ✚ it pushed some of us outside of our comfort zone...

But there were good things, too:

- ✚ everyone found a seat wherever they wanted because there was ample room; [chapel capacity is 80 people; one half of the sanctuary will seat 150 people]
- ✚ the words to the hymns were available on the t.v. screens and the font size was much larger than in the hymnals! Lol One person commented that they liked looking “up” when singing, instead of looking “down”
- ✚ and with everyone in the same room, I think it allowed for a better “connection” and full engagement with the worship experience...

Diane played the baby grand piano and the sound was beautiful! I preached from the pulpit and the sound system worked well and I enjoyed being able to see everyone while I was preaching. We even had a few folks join us after the service had started and they were able to easily slip in and find a seat, without the discomfort of having everybody look at them. All in all, a pretty good start! I am very prayerful that this shift will help us grow the 8 a.m. service and reach even more people for Christ.

So, we will try this for 8 weeks and the Sunday after Easter (April 3), surveys will be available for you to fill out and share your experiences/thoughts/ideas. The worship committee will then meet to discuss the responses and determine the next step...

Please be assured that I am not insensitive to the discomfort that change brings...and I do thank you all for your willingness to follow my leadership and give it a try. The worship committee and I appreciate your patience and cooperation, and your willingness to share your concerns with us. Keep thinking about it, talking to us, and worshipping God and we will make it through together.

Remember that our relocation experiment is for a good cause! After all, a growing worship service is an excellent “problem” to have. In fact, I hope and pray that *all of our services* will experience this same challenge, to the honor and glory of the One who has called us to ministry.
