Our District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Scott Grulke, has authorized our Pastor – Rev. Dr. Penelope H. Barber – to conduct a Charge Conference on Sunday, January 31, for the sole purpose of acting on a recommendation from the Casey UMC Trustees. A Charge Conference is required because the proposal alters the property holdings of the Casey UMC. Specifically, the Trustees are bringing the following proposal:

*****As of September 3, 2015: We, the trustees of the Casey UMC, recommend to the Casey UMC, that we deed 4 ft. of the property on the Western edge of the parsonage lot (located at 706 E. Washington Ave.), to the present next-door neighbor, Robert Brown.*****

This action would clean up the property line between the two properties, since Mr. Brown's clothes line and about 4 inches of his porch presently sit on the parsonage lot.

*Since this is a Charge Conference, all MEMBERS of the church who attend the called meeting will have a vote. Non-members may certainly attend and have voice, but they do not get to vote on the proposal. As per our rules of Discipline, all the members present at the meeting will constitute a quorum.
